

Behind The City Scene

Should growth pay its way?

It would be hard to find anyone who would not answer this question in the affirmative. It is an especially relevant question for the residents of Ward IV. Ward IV is a largely built out area of the City with some notable exceptions such as the Iliff station TOD area and a few remaining large vacant

commercial sites on S. Havana. There is a residential component planned for the Point at Nine Mile. We are burdened with traffic and too frequent criminal activity but not oil wells and large yet to be developed vacant swaths of land in the City's north and east quadrants.

Now saying growth should be paying its own way should be more than hollow pleasantries wafting from the lips of politicians! This is where "Capital Impact Fees" (CIF) come into play. The CIF has 7 included subcomponents ranging from Police/Fire to Libraries. These City imposed fees are payable at the time of the issuance of a building permit for any new residential units. The big problem is that they have not been adjusted since 2008 and are viewed by a clear majority of Council including myself as not being adequate to provide for new City infrastructure to serve the new residents.

When this occurs we in the established areas of the City are subsidizing new development. This should not occur. As we know in Colorado all new taxes must be voter approved per TABOR. On the other hand fees do not require a vote but there is a very important aspect regarding fees where they must only be used to support the resulting specific government service. If they are rationally based and used they will withstand a legal challenge asserting it as an unlawful tax. So it is necessary to carefully analyze the proposed fee. The proposed 2019 CIF's will range from essentially 3 to 5 thousand dollars depending upon the type of residential unit. This is in addition to the new water tap fee for each new residential unit. City Council will soon formalize the final increased CIF amount which is good public policy.


June will bring our mixer, Men's Club/Women's Club Mixer, with the men's club on June 8 and our Member/Member - Member/Guest Tournament on June 15.



Repair of Sidewalks: We will begin Phase One of our concrete repair project in May so keep an eye out for workmen. If you walk your animals on the sidewalks, you might have to take a different path while this project is underway.

Pools: The pools will open on Memorial Day, May 27th. Pool Rules will be posted at each pool. Please adhere to the rules. New homeowners

Planting: If you want to plant flowers in any common area in front of your home, you must plant only in containers. Common areas are maintained by the H.O.A.

Pet Control: Pickup after your pets at all times. Pets must be on a leash.

Golf Path: The golfers are out in force. No Trespassing signs are posted throughout the golf course for *your safety*. This means no walkers, runners, children playing or using golf course property for personal use is forbidden. Fines will be assessed by the Heather Ridge Golf Course.

Trash Removal Regulations: Please adhere to the following — trash pick-up begins at 7 am on Friday. Signs are posted at each trash enclosure as a reminder.

HOA Board Meetings: Homeowners are welcome to attend the monthly HOA Board meetings which are held on the second Wednesday of the month at 6:30 pm at the Heather Ridge Golf Club lower level, Room 19th Hole.

Visitor Parking: Visitor parking in only for visitors. Our Rules and Regulations are strictly enforced by Brownstone Services LLC., 720-879-4568. We residents have a two-car garage for our vehicles. Ticketing and towing rules are always in effect.



Please do not block visitor parking spaces during snow storms. Our landscaping company needs to pile snow in these areas.

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



Annual HOA Meeting: "Our annual meeting was both productive and very informative this year. Those in attendance voted by acclamation to reelect all current board members to new 1-3 year terms. Following a financial presentation, the members also ratified the 2019 budget. After a discussion of various fund raising alternatives those in attendance also supported a suggested increase in 2020 HOA fees of around \$25.00 dedicated to the reserve fund to complete our roof replacement project over the next 4 years.

Other topics discussed were the high cost of insuring the property against wind and hail damage, and the need for greater emphasis on water conservation going forward. (At \$84,000.00/year water is our largest budget item, closely followed by insurance.)" Barry McConnell, Board Member.

The board also asked that anyone interested in being considered for a position on the board please contact Roger Mitchell. The current board member's terms range from 1-3 years. Within a year, there will be a possible vacancy that will need to be filled. That will be in addition to an existing position left unfilled.

In the event that no unit owners are willing to serve on the board of directors, there would be a breakdown of the ability for the association to operate because there would be no board of directors to make decisions. In such a case, a receiver might have to be appointed to operate the association, but this would be a significant expense that unit owners would have to pay and all owners would be subject to the decisions of the receiver. Hopefully,

concerned and reasonable unit owners will eventually agree to serve on the board.

Second Notice-Free Residential Smoke Detectors: Aurora Fire Rescue will install free smoke detectors for residents who need them and will offer to check existing smoke detectors to ensure proper placement and working condition.

The National Fire Protection Association standards include installing smoke alarms inside each bedroom, outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home, including the basement. On levels without bedrooms, install alarms in the living room or near the stairway to the upper level or in both locations.

Alameda Ave. If you need to replace your garage door, it is acceptable to replace it with an eightpanel door. The six-panel doors are no longer available. You will notice the difference if you take a peek around the community.

Water Use: Please be aware that our water bill is our largest expense over the summer months, and not just because of our efforts to keep the grounds looking good. Please check the plumbing in your home. You would be surprised at how much water is wasted through a running toilet or a dripping faucet. If your aging toilet needs replacing, please consider one of the low-flow options available.


